Green Commitment

The gem of the Caribbean, overflowing with flora and fauna, the biodiversity of St. Barts is unequalled. As stewards of our island's natural assets, Le Barthélemy Hotel & Spa was built ethically and consciously, using environmentally friendly materials, from construction to interior design.

In Room commitment

One of the most important decisions we made when Le Barthélemy opened was to have you sleep in supreme comfort on traceable organic cotton sheets. A small detail perhaps, but to protect the places we love, every decision matters, including yours.

That is why, following a thorough and honest communication with our valued guests, we are proud to announce that Le Barth has reduced laundry water use by 20% between 2016 and 2022.

Ethical gifts

Our gifts also respect the environment! Each of our In-room gifts is recyclable and eco-responsible. 60% of in-room amenities come from ethical and eco-friendly labels. We have burlap bags and 100% compostable packaging.



Ecological cleaning

Since 2017, we have been using eco-certified laundry products, and have achieved a 60% reduction in the use of household products between 2017 and 2020 (room cleaning), to transform the rest into eco-certified products.

Reduced water consumption

In accordance with strict EU guidelines, all our bathroom sinks and showers are equipped with aerators to reduce water consumption. The gray water that flows down the drains of our rooms and our restaurants is internally filtered, treated, and reused to water the gardens of our oasis.

Paperless processes

Check-in and check-out at Le Barthélemy are both fast and ecological. They are done digitally and do not require the use of paper.

Food and beverage menus are also available via QR Code or at anytime on our free Le Barthélemy App.

Our responsible approach to dining

Our restaurant Amis St. Barth's zero-waste culinary approach has reduced our foodrelated carbon footprint, so you can feel good about what is on your plate. Our Chef Jérémy Czaplicki sources local products and shops daily, uses every part of the product and composting what is not reusable. Amis St. Barth also offers its guests vegan and vegetarian menus.

With Amis St. Barth's opening in October 2021, we've acquired new, innovative cuisine equipment to save more energy in gas and electricity when cooking. We also have selective storage.

Whenever possible, Le Barthélemy partners with local farmers and fishers to source and serve local fruits, vegetables and seafood. Not only does this approach aid the local economy, but also ensures that our guests enjoy the freshest foods, including fresh fish from the bay such as local Mahi-Mahi. Every part of this fish is used, including the egg to make our delicious tarama.

Ecological to-go packaging

Goodbye plastic. Located between the bay and the sea, we are supremely careful of anything that might harm the waterways which is why, at Le Barth, to-go cups and straws are made from eco-responsible, low impact, recycled paper.







Social & Education Commitment

We believe in the strength of a tight community. A society that grows together and works together is a reflection of the most noble traits of human nature. Being a sustainable hotel is about understanding this and knowing that as one succeeds, we all do. That's why since our 2016 opening, Le Barthélemy has extended its family to the greater St. Barts family because health, happiness and wellbeing should always be shared.

In order to limit the carbon impact linked to transportation, Le Barth employees are offered housing within 1 kilometer by walk.

Low-impact architecture

Part of St. Barts Nature Reserve, Le Barth was built and then rebuilt following Hurricane Irma. Featuring organic low-impact materials such as locally hewn stone and wood, the hotel focuses on preserving the natural environment of the island and maintaining its flora and fauna.

The architecture preserves the integrity of the Caribbean, all hotel spaces are optimized to make the most out of natural sunlight and reduce energy consumption.



Local solidarity

During an infrequent general water cut on the island, we were able to offer our water our neighbors and lent to all our satellite phone.

Le Barthélemy has always acted to preserve the idyllic setting of its island, protecting the fauna and flora, and acting for the good of its community.

Guided by this philosophy, we partner with Coral Restoration, an association committed to the restoration of coral reefs and the preservation of the environment.

Our collaboration is illustrated by the involvement of human means (awareness of our staff, beach cleaning and coral planting by our employees) and financial means (donations to support the actions of the association). In 2023, we launched a new meaningful experience offered to St. Barth visitors and inhabitants alike: adopting and replanting a coral directly on the reef. Every day, we work together for a better world.

Historical Commitment

Sustainability is about appreciating and preserving the fabric of a culture, its art, beauty, customs, flora and fauna. We demonstrate our respect for the culture and history of St. Barts in many ways, from the architectural choices we make to the treasures we hope will become souvenirs in our gift store. These details are the fabric of our history, of our belonging to St. Barth.

Careful framework

The hotel's roof and frame are reminiscent of the island's traditional architectural style. In the rooms, we designed the walls to resemble the latanier tree, a tree used in St. Barts to make hats. The pillows are also embroidered to resemble the island's local homes.

Thorough storytelling

The hummingbird, the emblematic bird of St. Barts, welcomes our guests at the reception desk, and locally produced rum is offered as a gift in the rooms upon arrival.



Raising awareness

Our smallest guests receive a stuffed turtle upon arrival. Although it may seem like a small detail, we believe that this gift will help raise awareness of the preservation of our marine treasures, such as the turtles in our bay that live just a few breaststrokes from Le Barthélemy.

One Island, one History

Every detail at Le Barth, from our signature sand dollar logo, which represents the perfect little jewel of nature found in the depths of our Bay, to the carefully selected amenities in the rooms, has been chosen with intention. We are proud of our island; our history and we want to share the magic of St. Barts with you.

Water recovery

Water is a precious commodity worldwide and particularly on islands.

That's why we collect "gray water", water from sinks, showers and bathtubs in our water treatment plant and use the filtered water to water the plants in the gardens.

We also use mulch on the plants to limit the amount of water required to keep our gardens lush, green and inviting.





Organic protection of St. Barts soil

We use organic fertilizers to feed our plants, and organic mosquito repellents without toxic products, which allows us to take care of the flora in an ecological way.

The journey to becoming a sustainable hotel is never ending, we continue on a path that pushes us to be better, greener. That is our promise to you, our team members and our St. Barts neighbors.
